Village of Granisle Received Provincial Recognition for Achieving Carbon Neutrality	Director Liversidge reported that the Village of Granisle received Provincial recognition and congratulations for achieving carbon neutrality.
<u>New Babine Elementary</u> <u>Secondary School</u>	Director Liversidge mentioned that the Village of Granisle is instating discussion with School District 91 Nechako- Lakes to provide heat energy to the new Babine Elementary Secondary School (BESS) similar to the Village of Telkwa and School District 54 Bulkley-Valley. The modules for the new school have been assembled on foundations and are incorporated into existing components of BESS at a cost of \$7 million.
<u>Hankin Avenue, Village of</u> <u>Telkwa</u>	Director Graf noted that the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure has increased the height of the barricades on Hankin Avenue in the Village of Telkwa. BC Hydro also donated trees to the Village of Telkwa to place on the east of Hankin Avenue.
<u>Village of Telkwa Hosted</u> Peddle Bikers from Texas	Director Graf thanked the Regional District for providing promotional bags to the Texas 4000 peddle bikers that traveled through the region from Texas on their way to Alaska. On August 19, 2014 at 2:00 p.m. the signage will be installed and a road hockey game will be played to celebrate the change of name.
<u>Nechako Valley Exhibition and</u> <u>Fall Fair</u>	Director Petersen extended an invitation to the Nechako Valley Exhibition and Fall Fair being held in Vanderhoof on August 15- 17, 2014. He mentioned that the fair is a great display of agriculture activity and has been operating for 48 years. Director Petersen was one of original founders and organizers of the event.
Dismantling of Houston Forest Products	Director Holmberg stated that the dismantling of Houston Forest Products has begun. The 2015 tax base for the District of Houston will be significantly changed. The provincial transition teams are completed and the District of Houston will be announcing a new branding in the near future.
