2015 Draft Final Budget

Attached as Schedule A is a draft final budget for 2015. As noted during the February 26th meeting, we accrued in 2014 invoices for the Burns Lake Hospital and the Vanderhoof Anesthetic Machine that were paid in 2015. This resulted in a deficit of \$2.3 million for 2014. After further review, the offsetting withdrawal from the capital reserve that was done in 2015 was also accrued into 2014, eliminating the deficit. This has been discussed with the Auditors and they agree with this approach.

Taxation has been increased to \$1,790,000 to bring the tax rate to \$0.54 per \$1,000, as requested during the February 26th Board meeting. The amount of short term borrowing has been reduced as a result.

Attached as Schedule B are graphs of taxation and the residential tax rate from 2001 to 2015.

Five Year Financial Projections

Attached as Schedule C are financial projections for the 5 year period from 2015 to 2019. In 2016, the short term borrowing of \$373,590 for the Burns Lake Hospital will be repaid and \$902,396 invested in the capital reserve. If we assume that the Fort St. James Hospital will be replaced in 2019, the capital reserve will have accumulated \$3,383,187 including interest. This would reduce the required borrowing to \$10.5 million to contribute \$15.2 million (40% of the projected cost of \$38 million). Hopefully, we could get this reduced to 20% to make the facility more affordable for the region.

The Board is being requested to rescind third reading of Bylaw No. 52 further in the agenda and give third reading and adoption to Bylaw No. 52 as amended.

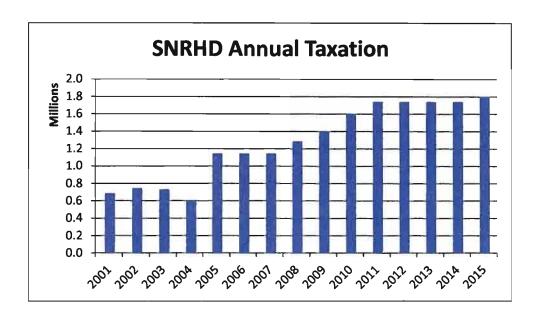

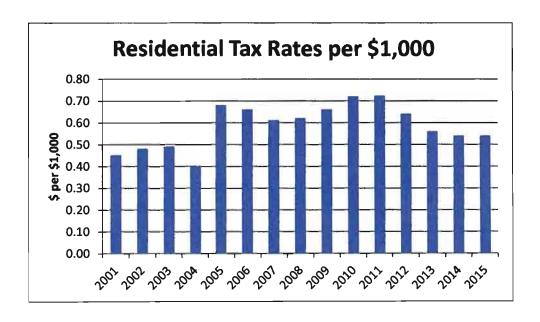
