Over the last three years Groundbreakers has worked closely with schools in Telkwa and Smithers to help build and support their gardens, lead experiential garden workshops in schools, run school garden clubs and has delivered a very successful summer local food and gardening camp. We are a unique group to the area particularly in our ability to work with schools to educate and assist in staff and students on how to grow, harvest, and prepare garden produce.

Groundbreakers' objectives with its School Garden Support and Kids Dig Food Camp are to connect school children to healthy local food, to each other, to nature and their community (including local seniors) through the construction and support of school and community gardening projects and hands-on education. Specifically, our school workshops, garden clubs, and camp will enable school-aged children to develop foundation skills in self-care and eating healthy, experience planting, caring for and harvesting local food as well as preparing the food in the kitchen in order to enjoy the end products of cooking and eating healthy food they have grown.

Describe how this proposal will benefit the community.

Discussions with staff of the Board of Education in the Bulkley Valley reveal that there is considerable interest amongst students, Parent Advisory Councils, and teachers to have food gardens on the school grounds and to increase education and exposure to healthy and fresh food. However, the capacity is not available at the schools to solely construct and maintain working vegetable gardens and to incorporate the gardens into required curriculum, and for the gardens to be maintained over the summer for the return of students in September. For example, the extension of the Muheim garden for community use and the venue for Groundbreakers' Kids Dig Food summer camp will not only provide much needed summer support, but also allow for local seniors to garden alongside students in May and June and to also be part of the summer camp. Groundbreakers is also well connected with the farmers in the region to include them and their produce in the workshops and camp in order for children to experience the scope of local food from garden beds to market size farms.

There are the environmental benefits of eating local, greening schoolyards, and giving kids hands-on experience with gardening, soil and growing. Educating school-age children is the key to getting parents and successive children to be turned on to food security, and to build pride in the simple skills, practical self-care, and growing and cooking skills. The summer camp and school programs provide the foundation and the means for our community to have access to local and healthy food, and connect with local food producers.





This application is regarding a Crown Grant to obtain additional land for extensive agriculture purposes. The subject property is located on unsurveyed crown land, near Fountain Lake, approximately 17 kilometres from the District of Vanderhoof. The application area is approximately 90 ha. in size.

The intent of this application is to provide additional arable land to their existing grazing lease that will allow the applicant to establish fencing, harvest merchantable timber, and clear land for pasture. The land is currently vacant and forested.

It is noted that the application area is outside of the proposed Vanderhoof Community Forest boundary. The applicant submitted a similar application in 2015. However, it was denied by the Ministry of Forests due to the conflict of uses between the Community Forest interests and the application.

The application area is not zoned under Regional District of Bulkley Nechako Zoning Bylaw No. 700, 1993 and is accessed by Blue Mountain FSR.
