Chair Petersen spoke of attending the Grand Opening event of the new Lakes District Hospital and Health Centre on January 22, 2015. The facility is amazing and all those that helped to advocate for the new facility can be very proud of a job well done.

Director Benedict noted that the process for the new facility began approximately 10 years ago. She recalled being told at that time that expectations were set very high and the possibility of all the requests being completed may not be possible. With the support of the community the majority of the requests were implemented in the new facility.

Director Strimbold noted that the opening of the new facility is a very exciting time for the Village of Burns Lake and the region. The facility will be officially open to the public on February 5, 2015.

Director Strimbold also mentioned the importance of community advocacy in regard to the building of a new facility and that it will be very important for the District of Fort St. James as a whole community to advocate for a new facility in that community.

Director MacDougall stated that he also attended the grand opening and looks forward to working on a new facility for Fort St. James. He spoke with the Honourable Terry Lake, Minister of Health at the Premier's Natural Resource Forum in Prince George on January 21, 2015.

Chair Miller spoke to the importance of never underestimating the strength of regional lobbying and a strong Regional Board position in regard to advocating for a new hospital in a community and receiving the funding required from the provincial government in moving such a project forward. He noted the business plan that was put forward in regard to the new Lakes District Hospital and thanked staff for their assistance. The steadfast determination of past Chair Ralph Roy in regard to his advocacy of the new hospital for Burns Lake was amazing.

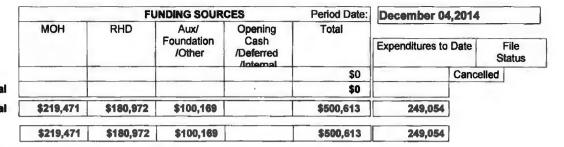

Regarding: Draft 2015 Final Budget

Attached as Schedule A is a draft final budget for 2015, which is substantially the same as the 2015 provisional budget that was approved by the SNRHD Board at its meeting on December 11, 2014, adjusted for actual results for 2014. Note that the provisional budget also assumed that the final bill for the Vanderhoof Outpatient renovations would be received and accrued in 2014. Since it has still not been received, it has been moved to the 2015 budget. Also, invoices for the construction of the Burns Lake Hospital and the Vanderhoof Anesthetic Machine that were received and accrued in December, were paid February, when our investments matured. As a result, we are showing a deficit of \$2.3 million at the end of December and also a capital reserve that is \$2.3 million higher than estimated. Taxation has not changed from the provisional budget.

Taxation is the same as last year, however the 3.1% increase in assessments has resulted in a decrease in the residential tax rate from \$0.54 per \$1,000 to \$0.53 per \$1,000. Schedule B includes graphs showing the history of annual taxation and the residential tax rate from 2001 to 2015.

The Board is being requested to give three readings to Bylaw No. 52 further in the agenda.

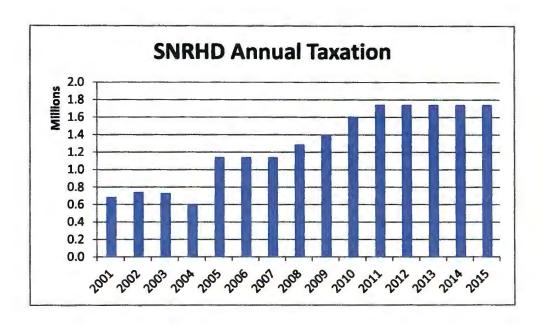

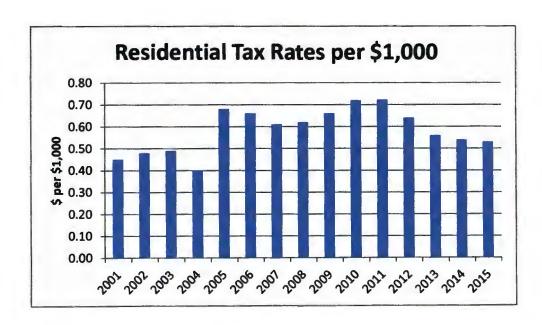

#### **Executive Summary:**

During the months of November 2014 to January 2015, the Lake District Hospital Project Team focused on construction project management. Work on the project continues to progress well. On December 4<sup>th</sup>, 2014 we received occupancy permit and formally took possession of the newly constructed Hospital building.

#### **Project Scope:**

PCL is on schedule with Hospital construction and all building components and furnishings have been procured and scheduled for delivery. All construction material deliveries to the site are continuously coordinated with the work progress to eliminate or minimize the need for on-site storage.

#### Major Construction progress up to date:

- > Masonry work is complete
- All building structure including the delivery ramp and Ambulance enclosure have been completed
- > The installation of exterior panels are 100% completed
- > Medical gas, pipe insulation and acoustic duct insulation 100% complete
- > All fans and HVAC systems are on site and 100% installed.
- > TELUS has completed its permanent servicing work, network connected and live
- Backfill has been completed to grade around the perimeter walls in conjunction with the perimeter drains and foundation waterproofing.
- ➤ Ceilings and flooring installation 100% completed



- Mechanical Room with Boilers and water softeners installation has been completed - tested and commissioned.
- ➤ Elevators installation 100% complete
- > Fire Suppression System 100% complete
- ➤ Electrical work is 100% complete
- > Medical equipment installation 90% complete
- ➤ An Erosion and Sedimentation Control plan have been completed for the project. PCL has established a silt fence perimeter, catch basin protections and check dams in the ditches downstream of the site.

#### Northern Health releases Houston health services review

Northern Health is making a commitment to strengthen primary care services in Houston after a review of health care in the community. Today, Northern Health will release the Houston health services review report, which identifies primary care services, as well as partnering with the community to implement the goals and recommendations, as priorities for improving health care in Houston.

In Fall 2014, Northern Health consulted with 53 physicians, staff, and stakeholders from various backgrounds and sectors throughout Houston and reviewed health care services in other communities in northern B.C.

The review report includes five key recommendations

- 1. Transform the Houston Health Centre into a primary care home and establish an inter-professional team with physicians and community health services, such as home and community care, public health nursing, and mental health and addictions, augmented by physiotherapy.
- 2. Develop a Primary Care Nurse function and consider expanding the nursing scope of practice from Registered Nurse First Call to Remote Nursing.
- 3. Work collaboratively with the community to recruit at least two full-time physicians to a practice based in the Houston Health Centre.
- 4. Collaborate further with B.C. Ambulance Service to determine partnerships that can benefit the community.
- 5. Work collaboratively with the local community, social services, education groups, and other key stakeholders in Houston to help strengthen and improve population health.

Northern Health is aware some Houston resident's see 24/7 urgent care as the solution to many of the community's health needs. Through the review process, Northern Health determined this would not provide the most valuable benefits for the community at this time. It is well-established evidence that urgent and emergent care are not the solution to most health needs.

Northern Health will act on the recommendations identified in the Houston health services review with a focus on developing strong primary care services, including working collaboratively with the community to recruit physicians and organizing our community services into inter-professional teams. This will have the greatest impact on improving the health status of Houston residents.

Participants in the process have been provided with the report and a presentation on the results. Northern Health would like to thank the participants and the community for their involvement and continued support.

# Lakes District Hospital and Health Care Centre open for business on February 4, 2015

The state-of-the-art Lakes District Hospital and Health Care Centre has been completed six months ahead of

schedule and is scheduled to open on February 4, 2015.

Project Manager Paul
Rudecki says the
construction crew has
received an occupancy
permit, with the main
hospital building now
complete. Mild winter
weather, combined with
good construction and
timely execution by the
contractor, PCL Constructors
Westcoast Inc., led to the
early completion date. The
exact number of people

that worked on the project was not available, but Rudecki says about 10 to 20 percent of all employees were local residents.

"Move-in is scheduled to start on February 2 which means we'll move our services from the old hospital to the new facility on February 2, 3 and 4," says Rudecki. "By the end of February 4, the new hospital will be open for patients."

Health Care Relocation Services, an Ontario-based firm, will help facilitate the move from the old facility to the



new hospital, with their staff brought in to help with the transition.

"We also have all our Northern Health employees being summoned to do this work on the move-in date," says Rudecki. "All the moving rehearsals have been done and all the schedules have been posted. All that needs to be done is just an execution of the move."

The hospital's grand opening is scheduled for Thursday, January 22, 2015, from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m., with Minister of Health Terry Lake scheduled to attend along with representatives from local First Nations, and area dignitaries.

"There will be extensive cleaning required after the tours," says Rudecki. "We'll need to do thorough infection control to ensure the hospital is ready for move-in."

The \$55-million capital project features 16 beds, including 13 acute care beds; one isolation room; one palliative care room; and one labour/delivery/recovery site. The two-storey building is 6,100 square metres (65,000 square feet), and is a green and energy-efficient facility designed to achieve Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Gold certification. The project cost is being shared between the Province of BC

and the Stuart Nechako Regional Hospital District.

PCL Constructors Westcoast Inc. built the facility with CEI Architecture as the lead architects for the project.

The parking lot and landscaping will be completed in the fall, with the old hospital scheduled for demolition in September 2015.

Rudecki says the countdown to opening the new hospital has produced an upbeat feeling throughout the Burns Lake community. "Everyone is trying to participate and it's a very vibrant situation," he says. •

## A message from Marie Hunter — Health Services Administrator, Lakes District

The new Lakes District Hospital and Health care centre will offer our community a hospital in a modern environment, something that they've never had before. And just as important, it will give our staff the ability to deliver client-focussed health services, which will ultimately improve outcomes for patients.

This will be a state-of-the-art facility for a community

that's been operating with a hospital built by the United Church and volunteer groups in the 1950s. They moved into the facility in 1959/60, so this new complex will be a huge change for our community.

Designed for primary health care delivery, that means our hospital will deliver wrap-around integrated health care. This will be a building where an integrated model of care can flourish.

I think that the public should know that in a building that has state-of-the-art technology, that it's not just about the size of the facility. It's about all of the new systems, from the decontamination systems to the ceiling lifts and more.

The community tours will give the public a snapshot of all the benefits that the new building offers. For example, you'll see how we've met all the provincial standards around such features as single patient rooms and our new sprinkler system. The public should also be aware that during the move, every hospital service will be impacted. As a result, some of the support services will move early, such as supplies, housekeeping and laundry, to ensure that cleaning has been completed and there are supplies to set up the new site.

Our move schedule will take place over three days, with patients moving on the morning of the third day, February

4. It will be a very compressed process, with the move taking place literally across the roadway from the Emergency department into the main entrance of the new hospital. There will not be any ambulances involved.

I visualize it going very smoothly. We'll have hiccups for sure. But people are so very excited that they can tolerate a lot. The community, right down to the arts community, have all participated, and that has been a huge benefit. Everybody has had the opportunity to give input on this project.

Personally, I've never had the experience of going to work in a new facility that met all the standards for building requirements and modern technology. It's a dream come true. Now it's time for our community to put our mark on it!

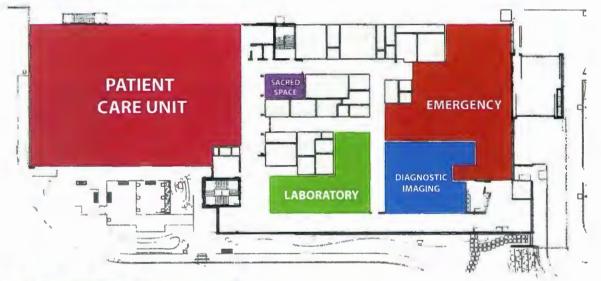

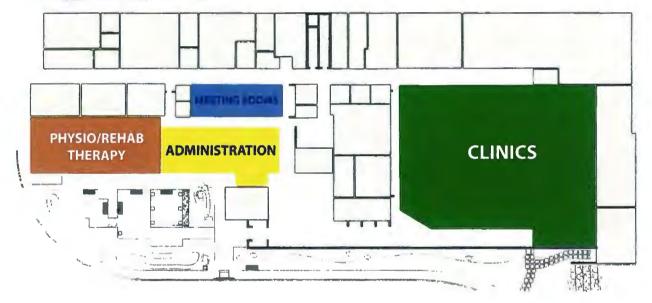
