Village of Granisle Director McGuire mentioned that the Village of Granisle's water

treatment project is proceeding. The community has also

constructed a new shelter at one of its park areas.

Fort St. James Conifex
Sawmill Reducing Production

Director Greenaway reported that Fort St. James has recently been impacted and will continue to be impacted by reduction in

operations at the Conifex Sawmill. The sawmill reduced operations for two weeks in November and will be reducing operations for another two weeks in December with a further reduction of its production in January 2019 impacting

approximately 70 jobs.

Village of Telkwa Bylaw

Review

Director Layton commented that the Village of Telkwa will be conducting a Bylaw review in early 2019 and will be investigating the option of accessing and utilizing RDBN Planning Staff in the

future.

Fort St. James Legion Alternate Director Greenaway mentioned that the Fort St. James

Legion has offered its building to the Friendship Centre to operate an extreme cold weather shelter. The shelter will be

able to host 30-40 people.

Stuart Lake Shoreline Erosion at Fort St. James Spirit Square

Alternate Director Greenaway reported that there has been a significant loss of shoreline at Spirit Square in Fort St. James

that will need a significant amount of work to ensure further

shoreline is not lost.

Economic Diversification Plan

-Village of Burns Lake

Director Riis-Christianson spoke of the Village of Burns Lake's Economic Diversification plan. He noted as Director for Electoral Area "B" he will be working on the plan with the Village of Burns

Lake.

Meeting with John Rustad,

MLA Nechako Lakes

Director Funk noted that she met with John Rustad, MLA Nechako Lakes and he requested information in regard to the

needs of the Village of Burns Lake.

Village of Burns Lake

-Manganese in Water Update guidelines are changing in reg

Director Funk mentioned that Health Canada announced that its guidelines are changing in regard to manganese in water. She noted that Village of Burns Lake residents have been receptive

to the information that has been provided.

VERBAL REPORTS (CONT'D)

Water Use

Director Fisher mentioned he has had conversation with residents in regard to water, water use including streams and ponds and the impacts in development areas. He suggested the need to have further discussion in the future.

Meeting with an Individual Embarking on a Hemp Operation

Director Fisher had a meeting with an individual embarking on the development of a large scale hemp operation and is looking for certified organic land in Electoral Area "A" (Smithers Rural). He spoke of the potential investment to the region.

Bulkley Valley Recreation Groups

Director Fisher met with a number of recreation groups within the Bulkley Valley and provided information in regard to potential support for the groups utilizing RDBN grant in aid or gas tax funds. He noted that a meeting is being planned for the spring to have further discussions. Director Fisher spoke of recreation being an economic driver in the region.

Community of Houston Housing and Labour Concerns

Director Brienen spoke of the tremendous changes in the past 12 months in Houston. He noted the community is starting to see LNG activity also. Director Brienen commented that available housing is becoming an issue along with labour shortages in the community. He expressed the need to continue to discuss housing and labour shortages in the region during the RDBN strategic planning session in 2019. Director Brienen also noted the need to address the potential impact to low income housing and social services in communities as the region potentially moves into a boom cycle in the area.

Project on

Rio Tinto - Water Management Director Petersen noted he has been invited to meet with the consultants conducting Rio Tinto's Water Management Project December 14, 2018. Discussion took place in regard to meeting with the consultants to understand the project.

Director Newells attandence at District of Houston Council Meeting

Director Newell expressed his appreciation to the District of Houston in allowing his attendance at its council meeting. He noted that several municipal projects are joint projects with Electoral Area "G" (Houston Rural) and it is beneficial to discuss how and where funding is utilized and needed.

Bank Closure in Fraser Lake

Director Storey commented that work continues to be done to address the announced closure of the bank in Fraser Lake.

<u>Fund</u>

Nechako Kitimaat Development Director Storey mentioned that she participated in a tour of areas within Fraser Lake that have received funding from the Nechako Kitimaat Development Fund.

VERBAL REPORTS (CONT'D)

Spruce Beetle Symposium -Smithers, B.C.

Director Storey noted that she attended the Spruce Beetle Symposium in Smithers. She commented that the symposium brought forward long term views and building a strong foundation in communites while changes occur within industry. Director Storey spoke of the need to be prepared for long term planning and having plans developed for shovel ready projects and being prepared for opportunities that arise. The summit also discussed place based approach and using local knowledge and determining and understanding community assets. Discussion also took place in regard to the Species at Risk Act Section 11 Conservation Agreement for the Conservation of the Southern Mountain Caribou.

Chair Thiessen along with Director Lambert also attended the Spruce Beetle Symposium and topics for discussion also included the impacts to the environment, water, etc. He noted the value of attending the symposium.

Skateboard Park in Vanderhoof

Chair Thiessen mentioned the District of Vanderhoof is working with Director Petersen, Electoral Area "F" (Vanderhoof Rural) and local skateboarders to develop a skate board park in the community that will hopefully be completed in approximately one year. He noted that it has been very encouraging to see the enthusiasim of the local skateboard group.

Vanderhoof Housing Concerns Chair Thiessen also spoke of the housing issues in Vanderhoof and surrounding area. He noted the challenges associated with lack of qualified carpenters, changes to financing for housing and changes to the building code impacting housing in the community.
