Lake Babine – Fire Protection Alternate Director McGuire mentioned that the Village of Tachet Granisle has been approached by Lake Babine Nation to have the Village of Granisle Volunteer Fire Department provide fire protection for the community of Tachet. Alternate Director McGuire has had a brief discussion with Director Newell, Electoral Area "G" (Houston Rural) but indicated further discussion needs to take place with the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako. Alternate Director McGuire mentioned that the RCMP in Granisle RCMP and Granisle – Cram the Cruiser Event will be conducting their Cram the Cruiser event to assist the local food bank. Director Greenaway reported that the District of Fort St. James Physicians – Fort St. James will have two new physicians in 2018, a wife and husband team. Burns Lake Centre Street Director Beach mentioned that the \$180,000 Centre street Paving Project paving project is complete along with the \$40,000 paving patching in the community. Economic Diversification Director Beach reported that the new Economic Diversification Project Projects Committee began in Burns Lake on October 23, 2017 and is being chaired by Village of Burns Lake Councillor Michael Riis-Christianson. Chair Miller also attended the meeting. The funding was granted through the Rural Dividend Fund. The meeting was three hours long and produced some good ideas moving forward. Village of Burns Lake – New Director Beach mentioned that the Village of Burns Lake has recently hired a new Chief Financial Officer and is in the process Hires of hiring a new Recreation Director. Director Beach stated that the Village of Burns Lake will be Village of Burns Lake -By-Election January, 2018 holding a By-election January 20, 2018. Fraser Lake Community Bus Director Lindstrom reported that Fraser Lake has recently Coming Soon acquired its community bus with grant funding from the Highway 16 Community Transportation Grant Program and Director Parker, Electoral Area "D" (Fraser Lake Rural). He has volunteered to pick up the bus and deliver it to Fraser Lake. Cops for Cancer Tour de Director Lindstrom mentioned that Village of Fraser Lake Councillor Craig Le Poidevin and his wife Cathy participated in North the Cops for Cancer Tour de North biking approximately 1000 kms. Grocery Store to Open in Director Lindstrom spoke of a new grocery store opening soon in the old Super Value location in Fraser Lake. Director Parker Fraser Lake mentioned that it will be a locally owned and operated store. He spoke of the benefit of having a grocery store in the community and not having to travel for daily grocery shopping.

Fraser Lake Community Forest	Director Lindstrom commented that the Village of Fraser Lake has been awarded a Community Forest and is currently in negotiations with West Fraser Sawmill in Fraser Lake.
<u>Rio Tinto Alcan</u>	Director Parker received a call from Justus Benckhuysen, Nechako Operations Coordinator, Rio Tinto Alcan last night to inform him that due to the recent 10 day rainfall over Tahtsa Reservoir of over 330 mm Rio Tinto Alcan is increasing its outflow of water in the Nechako Reservoir from 32 m ³ to 100 m ³ . Mr. Benckhuysen indicated that they would continue to monitor the situation and assess the flood potentials for 2018.
Fort St. James Community Forum	Director MacDougall mentioned that the District of Fort St. James hosted a Community Forum and brought forward five topics for community discussion. He noted that it went very well.
Laidlaw Street Lighting Alternative Approval Process	Director Fisher commented that he hosted an open house for the Laidlaw Street Lighting Alternative Approval Process at the trailer park located within the proposed service area. He mentioned that it was a good way to conduct an open house.

Northern Health set up receiving centres and did an excellent job to meet the needs of the central interior communities.
<u>Town of Smithers Town Hall</u> <u>Meeting</u>	Director Bachrach mentioned that the Town of Smithers held a Town Hall meeting to discuss the plan for a new Arts & Culture Centre that would house the library and art gallery at the end of Main Street by Veteran's Park in order to keep Main Street vibrant. There were over 100 people in attendance and the meeting was live streamed on Facebook.
Rosenthal Road (Dohler Flats) Restoration	Director Bachrach reported that Town of Smithers Council voted to repair Rosenthal Road (Dohler Flats) at a cost of \$375,000 which is funded mostly by Federal Gas Tax Funds. The road provides the only access to the waste water treatment plant.
<u>Town of Smithers Parking</u> <u>Lot</u>	Director Bachrach spoke of the ribbon cutting ceremony taking place October 27, 2017 to open the Second Avenue parking lot with an electric vehicle charging station. Director Fisher, Electoral Area "A" (Smithers Rural) provided support through Federal Gas Tax Funds.
Northern Health, Northern BC Tourism and RDBN SWOT Meetings	Director Newell commented that he also attended Northern Health's fall meeting and noted the focus for the Northwest Regional Hospital District and Northern Health is the new Mills Memorial Trauma Centre. Director Newell also attended the Northern BC Tourism Meeting in Prince George, October 16-17, 2017 and the RDBN Strategic Workforce Opportunities Team (SWOT) meeting in Burns Lake October 24, 2017. He mentioned that the SWOT meeting had good attendance and is moving forward with initiatives and the consultant will provide an interim report in the near future.

He stated that he is willing to listen to both sides and that it's important to be respectful in forming an educated decision in regard to the potential project. Regional Strategic Priorities Fund	Director Repen mentioned that the Village of Telkwa is awaiting the results of the UBCM Strategic Priorities Fund and will continue promoting the advantages and beauty of the area and grow in a positive sustainable direction.
