Fort St. James Primary Care Facility - Update

Director Greenaway mentioned that the Fort St. James Primary Care Society received an update from Michael Hoefer, Regional Director, Capital Planning and Support Services, Northern Health. Northern Health (NH):

- > has notified the unsuccessful and successful proponents of the Lease and Tenant improvement Request for Proposals:
- is currently negotiating the lease rate;
- once negotiations are complete schematics and development design drawings will be finalized;
- Completing final financing details:
 - NH is contributing approximately \$1.6 Million for the Capital
 - NH confirmed the SNRHD's contribution of 20%;
- Still on schedule and will be moving forward quickly;

VERBAL REPORTS (CONT'D)

Mental Health Issues

Director Benedict brought forward concerns in regard to the mental health issues that are being experienced in the north and what is being done to address the issues. She mentioned the need to invite Northern Health to a future SNRHD meeting to discuss the issue and available mental health counselling in each of the communities in the SNRHD. Melany de Weerdt, CAO commented that Northern Health had the issue on its spring meeting agenda but deferred the topic to its fall meeting. Director Benedict spoke to the lack of mental health counselling for adults. Staff will invite Northern Health to a future meeting to discuss mental health in the region.

Director Thiessen noted that in a recent meeting with physicians and the BC Rural Doctors in Vanderhoof, mental health was brought forward as an issue and frustrations were expressed in regard to a lack of information as to who and what is available in Vanderhoof.

Discussion took place regarding the lack of personnel and information in regard to accessing mental health services in Northern Health and Ministry of Children and Family Development.

Village of Burns Lake and Northern Health – Community Ambassador Committee Director Illes mentioned that the Village of Burns and Northern Health have joined together to form a Community Ambassador Committee for the Lakes District. The initiative is to assist in the recruitment of physicians. Two new physicians have arrived and are currently working at the Lakes District Hospital and Health Centre.

Meeting with Dr. Dave, Snadden Rural Doctors' UBC Chair in Rural Health and Dr. Stuart Johnston, Associate Director, Rural Coordination Centre of B.C. Director Thiessen reported that on June 8, 2017 he met with Dr. Dave Snadden, Rural Doctors' UBC Chair in Rural Health and Dr. Stuart Johnston, Associate Director, Rural Coordination Centre of B.C. (RCCbc) in Vanderhoof to discuss rural health care. They are travelling to 200 communities in rural B.C. and one of the key topics of discussion was mental health and a lack of service provisions. He spoke to the daunting case load that is often experienced by the Ministry of Children and Family Development and other agencies when addressing mental health needs.

Meeting in Vanderhoof RE: Opioid Issues

Director Thiessen mentioned that a meeting is being scheduled in Vanderhoof with the RCMP, healthcare and high school representatives in regard to opioid concerns and potential issues.

Stuart Lake Hospital Replacement Director MacDougall noted that he attended a meeting with the Fort St. James Primary Care Society and John Rustad, MLA Nechako Lakes and it was recommended that Fort St. James continue to lobby the provincial government for the Stuart Lake Hospital Replacement.

Seniors Care Facility in Fort St. James

Director MacDougall reported that a community plan to acquire the closed Sowchea Elementary School for a Seniors Care Facility has recently been initiated. A meeting has been planned for June 29, 2017, with physicians, First Nations, Northern Health, Fort St. James Primary Care Society, Vanderhoof long term care facility representatives and stakeholders to discuss options moving forward.

Fort St. James Primary Care Society and Northern Health Meeting Melany de Weerdt, CAO mentioned that a follow-up meeting is scheduled for June 28, 2017 in Fort St. James with the Fort St. James Primary Care Society and Northern Health to discuss an update in regard to the Primary Care Facility. Roxanne Shepherd, Treasurer, SNRHD will be in attendance.

Regarding: Financial Statements – June 30, 2017

Attached are the financial statements for the Stuart-Nechako Regional Hospital District for the six months ending June 30, 2017.

2017 payments to date for Northern Health include the annual capital grants for \$413,375 and the first claim for the St John Hospital Patient Monitoring System for \$66,768. Payments left to make include \$105,200 for phone system replacements at St. John Hospital and Southside Health Centre, payments for Fort St James primary care facility, and the balance of the St. John patient monitoring (total budget \$130,000). At June 30, 2017 the SNRHD had a surplus of \$74,547. This surplus reflects the fact that the revenue from taxation has not yet been recorded.

At June 30, 2017 there was \$1.48 million in cash and investments, including \$1,379,122 in the capital reserve and \$1,625 remaining in a separate donation account that is committed for the Healing Garden at the Burns Lake Hospital.

There is no debt outstanding at this time.

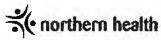

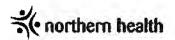
