DELEGATION

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORTATION & INFRASTRUCTURE – Carl Lutz, District Manager RE: Update (Highway 16 Reclassification)

Chair Miller welcomed Carl Lutz, District Manager, Ministry of Transportation & Infrastructure.

Mr. Lutz provided YouTube Videos regarding winter maintenance, avalanche control and load restrictions.

Director Thiessen mentioned concerns regarding the size and coarseness of the sand being used on the highway in the Vanderhoof area. Mr. Lutz explained that contractors must meet certain criteria for the size and coarseness of sand utilized on the highway, depending on the highway classification.

Discussion took place regarding the reclassification of Highway 16 from a Class B highway to a Class A highway. Mr. Lutz noted the reclassification would mean more crews and equipment on the highway and the snow removal for snow accumulation of 4-6 cm. There will be a quicker response time and coarser sand. There are noticeable differences with the reclassification but there will still be challenges associated with maintaining winter roads. This change is specific to winter maintenance, Highway 16 from the Alberta border to Prince Rupert and sections of Highway 97. There are provisions in the contracts between the province and road maintenance contracts that allow for negotiations for reclassification of highways. This is still in the process and details have not yet been released. At this time there will be no changes to the classification of tributary highway such as Highway 27 to Fort St. James and Highway 118 to Granisle.

Discussion took place regarding adequate tires during the winter months on transport trucks that travel through the region. Mr. Lutz noted that the CVSE (Commercial Vehicle Safety and Enforcement) oversees the inspection of proper tires on transport vehicles.

Concerns were brought forward regarding winter maintenance and the need to have more consistency between road maintenance contractors throughout the region. Mr. Lutz mentioned that communication between road maintenance contractors and the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MoTI) does occur and MoTI will continue to work to improve on the issue. Mr. Lutz indicated that he is very willing to meet with people with specific concerns to address any issues.

Discussion took place regarding tire inflation systems utilized to traverse roads that are less than 100% and that CVSE may be the department to discuss tire inflation systems.

Mr. Lutz noted that there is some significant work planned for the region along with a similar budget to 2013. At this time the work and budget have not yet been released to the public.

Mr. Lutz mentioned that the MoTI hosts a pre-winter stakeholders meeting to provide information and discuss upcoming winter maintenance. He noted that in the past the meetings have not always been well attended. It was mentioned that information regarding the meetings can be sent to the RDBN to be distributed to its Directors. There is a toll free number that can be contacted to report any issues and problems that will be distributed to the appropriate people to resolve.

Discussion took place regarding the challenges in the event of an accident that closes the road for long periods of time. If the RCMP determine that the accident is a crime scene a process needs to be followed and they work closely with MoTI to address the road closure but of first importance is the crime scene.

Chair Miller thanked Mr. Lutz for attending the meeting.

Director Bachrach spoke of concerns regarding the future of a recycling depot in Smithers. He provided an overview of the future of the Smithers and Area Recycling Society due to the inability to meet MMBC's deadlines to become a depot under MMBC's guidelines. The Smithers and Area Recycling Society has indicated that it intends to apply for depot status under MMBC in the future. Director Bachrach noted the implications to Smithers, Electoral Area "A" (Smithers Rural) and other communities such as Telkwa, Houston and Burns Lake that utilize the Smithers and Area Recycling Society's depot.

Janine Dougall, Director of Environmental Services noted that Allen Langdon, Managing Director, Multi-Material BC (MMBC) has indicated that he would like to schedule a meeting with the RDBN and municipal representatives in early June to allow for the development of a coordinated approach for the Packaging and Printed Paper Program (PPP) and determine the service gaps in the region. The next round of service provision in the Regional District is expected to be launched in the second quarter of 2015 and planning will begin in the summer 2014. Mr. Langdon has mentioned that MMBC is not guaranteeing services in the second quarter of 2015 as it will be dependent on the signing of more producers to provide MMBC with financial resources to expand and sign additional contracts for services.
