DELEGATIONS

<u>RIO TINTO ALCAN – Gareth Manderson, General Manager and Lianne Olson, Stakeholder</u> and Community Relations Liaison – RE: Update

Chair Miller welcomed Gareth Manderson, General Manager and Lianne Olson, Stakeholder and Community Relations Liaison, Rio Tinto Alcan. Ms. Olson introduced Jackie Lytle, Communications and Communities Advisor, Nechako Watershed, Rio Tinto Alcan.

Mr. Manderson noted that he has transferred from Rio Tinto's operations in Australia recently and spoke to the quality of individuals working in Rio Tinto Alcan's (RTA) operations in both Australia and B.C. Mr. Manderson mentioned that the commissioning of Rio Tinto Alcan's Kitimat Smelter Moderation Project has been very successful. RTA recently provided a tour to approximately 2000 people to look at the new operations. RTA is very focused on the modernization and success of the smelter. The hope is that the modernization will increase the life of the smelter by 60 years but that will require RTA's ability to understand the interests of stakeholders and communities in the Nechako Watershed. In order to have long term success Mr. Manderson spoke to the importance of finding ways to work with the residents to understand their issues, concerns and needs.

Chair Miller mentioned the Northwest Resource Benefits Alliance (NWRBA) and the potential to work with Rio Tinto Alcan to share and redirect resource benefits to local governments for future long term sustainability in the region. Mr. Manderson mentioned that he has experience in discussing revenue sharing and he would be comfortable discussing revenue sharing with the NWRBA in an appropriate forum. Mr. Manderson noted that he attended the Union of B.C.

<u>RIO TINTO ALCAN – Gareth Manderson, General Manager and Lianne Olson, Stakeholder</u> and Community Relations Liaison – RE: Update (Cont'd)

Municipalities Convention in Victoria, September 26-30, 2016 to get an understanding of the interests of the Provincial and Local Governments in the region.

Director Newell mentioned the Northwest Regional Hospital Board of Directors concerns in regard to Sulphur Dioxide (SO₂) particulates being emitted into the air from the RTA Kitimat Smelter and scrubbers needed to reduce SO₂ levels. Mr. Manderson mentioned that the Kitimat Smelter is below British Columbia and European safety benchmark regulations in regard to SO₂ emissions. It was decided during the modernization project to install an aggregated collection system wherein they collect emissions and put them through scrubbing facilities with a higher stack, a higher velocity and temperature to assist with the increase in production. With the increase in production these adjustments have mitigated the potential increase in SO₂ levels at the modernized Kitmat Smelter to compare to the smelter prior to the modernization project.

Director Thiessen mentioned that he had met with Mr. Manderson on October 19th and is looking forward to building a new relationship with Rio Tinto Alcan and working to develop a water use plan for the Nechako Reservoir. The community of Vanderhoof wants to work towards further relationship development with Rio Tinto Alcan.

Chair Miller stated the importance of Rio Tinto Alcan understanding stakeholder concerns and the integral link of the RDBN in regard to the water and air shed and developing a water management plan for the Nechako Reservoir.

Chair Miller encouraged having further conversations regarding the Northwest Resource Benefits Alliance and thanked Mr. Manderson, Ms. Olson and Ms. Lytle for attending the meeting.

Director Lindstrom spoke to discussing in the past with Ms. Fresco the possibility of having riprap in the Nautley River to assist in raising the water levels of Fraser Lake. Ms. Fresco noted that the issue has been included in the strategy as Fraser Lake's issue. Moving forward in the funding and implementation plan connections between organizations and agencies that can assist in addressing the issue will be completed and hopefully projects will be able to move forward. Ms. Fresco has also had discussion with the Northwest Invasive Plant Council and how they could assist with the issues.

FRASER BASIN COUNCIL – Theresa Fresco, Assistant Regional Manager, Upper Fraser RE: Update (Cont'd)

Director Thiessen spoke to the changes to the water bed of the Nechako River and the impacts on the future health of the river. He noted the community of Vanderhoof is asking the question "How can the community be involved and not do further damage or damage the downstream health of the river." Ms. Fresco noted that the University of Northern B.C. research water sub group called the Integrated Water Research group that are researching water quantity, quality and sedimentation on areas such as the Nechako River and watershed.

Ms. Fresco stated that UNBC is also developing a centralized location "water portal" that will store all the information from the University, Province and First Nations in one location on the Nechako River and Reservoir.

Director Greenaway commented that there has been a lot of assistance from UNBC at the Nechako Roundtable Technical Advisory Group. The administrative support for the Nechako Roundtable is located in Prince George but Ms. Fresco has spent a lot of time travelling through the region in regard to her work on the Roundtable. Director Benedict mentioned that there is a need for residents located near the Nechako Reservoir to comment and provide input.

Sustainable Funding for Watershed Governance Initiative (SFWGI) was discussed. Ms. Fresco has informally invited Rio Tinto Alcan and will provide formal invitations to Rio Tinto Alcan and other industries along with local government, provincial government, Department of Fisheries, Chambers of Commerce and other stakeholders to discuss the pilot project funding.

Discussion took place in regard to the water flow temperatures impacting salmon returns and the role of Rio Tinto Alcan regarding flow levels of the Nechako River.

Chair Miller questioned the impact from Canadian Nation Railway (CN) on the river system. He noted the Regional Board's concern in regard to dangerous goods and the potential impacts of a CN derailment along with response times. The waterways are an extremely valuable resource and it is very important for everyone to understand their value. Ms. Fresco noted that CN is not currently at the table but the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure is a participant in the discussions and those concerns have been raised. Ms. Fresco spoke of meeting with CN's Environmental Manager and encouraging future discussions.

Discussion took place regarding education and lobbying efforts in regard to funding and moving initiatives forward regarding the health of the Nechako Watershed. Ms. Fresco noted that funds are limited and priorities have had to be established to receive the most impact.

Director Parker spoke to involving the agriculture sector in the health of the watershed. The Nechako River and Reservoir are surrounded by agriculture lands. Ms. Fresco mentioned that she is currently working to build relationships in the agriculture sector and any assistance would be beneficial.

Chair Miller thanked Ms. Fresco for attending the meeting.

Omineca Beetle Action Coalition -Sharon Tower, Executive Director -RE: Update

Chair Miller welcomed Sharon Tower, Executive Director, Omineca Beetle Action Coalition.

Omineca Beetle Action Coalition -Sharon Tower, Executive Director - RE: Update (Cont'd)

Ms. Tower mentioned that she has been visiting communities in the region to provide updates in regard to the Omineca Beetle Action Coalition (OBAC).

Ms. Tower spoke to OBAC being formed in 2005 to review the impacts of the Mountain Pine Beetle epidemic on communities and plan for when the full impacts become a reality. Communities are now experiencing the impacts of the Mountain Pine Beetle on the midterm timber supply and analysis shows there will be a loss of 20,000 jobs over the next 5-10 years. The Annual Allowable cut is also being reduced by 13 million m³ per year for the next five years.

OBAC was to be funded by the province until 2017. The Coalition still has the support of the province but was not granted continued funding. Other funding options are being investigated.

OBAC strategies and action items were developed in 2006 to 2008 and 70% of the action items have been completed or are being completed currently. One of those strategies included transportation which is critical to education, diversification, industry, etc. Having a unified voice moving forward to the province enabled the Coalition to secure meetings with Deborah Bowman, Assistant Deputy Minister, Transportation and Policy Programs, Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure to move forward, although complex, a tangible plan for Highway 16 transportation.

Three strategies that have had less uptake due to various reasons, one being, time for community collaboration are:

- Tourism;
- Community and social services supports;
- Attraction and retention.

Ms. Tower noted that she has been speaking with staff at the Village of Burns Lake and encouraging the use of strategic plans that OBAC has already completed work on, social ready projects, that individual communities can utilize.

The role of the Coalition moving forward will continue to focus on the strategies developed which mostly focused on the forest sector as communities continue to transition and attempt to diversify. The Coalition provides a unified voice to focus on the current needs and issues found collectively throughout the region.

In 2014, OBAC completed a Forest Policy Paper that identified two key initiatives:

- 1. More input into the management decisions made by the Province;
 - the Province has committed to working on the 18 action items outlined;
- 2. Continued coordination of conversations with the Province:
 - Eg: Regional Wildfire Forum:
 - Highlight from the meeting:

- Need for the continued coordination by the Coalition to assimilate information and bring forward to the Province in a unified manner.

OBAC also has a detailed diversification and implementation plan that is available on OBAC's website. Ms. Tower spoke to the need for continued conversation with the Province and working with the Members of Parliament in the region to provide a joint media release for the Federal Government to continue to support the Coalition.

Director Repen spoke to the importance of advocating and receiving the attention of the Federal Government in regard to funding for OBAC and initiatives to assist with the impacts from the Mountain Pine Beetle epidemic. He spoke to OBAC, funding for OBAC and diversification being critical for the region. Ms. Tower mentioned that on November 18, 2016 OBAC is meeting with Nathan Cullen, MP Skeena Bulkley Valley. Ms. Tower extended an invitation to attend the meeting.

Chair Miller spoke of the capacity challenges faced by small Municipalities and Regional Districts and the need to work together in a collaborative unified manner to bring forward issues to the Province and Federal Governments.

Chair Miller thanked Ms. Tower for attending the meeting.
