2015 UBCM Premier/Cabinet Minister Meetings

The deadline for submission of resolutions to the 2015 Union of B.C. Municipalities is June 30, 2015.

The following 2015 UBCM Premier/Cabinet Minister Meetings and purpose for meetings were discussed:

- Attorney General and Minister of Justice

- Emergency Services the number and length of events being experienced;
 - (CAO's of RDBN, RD Fraser-Fort George and Caribou RD working to develop a paper that will outline requirements, levels of coverage required, history of events in the three regions.)

- Ministry of Health

- Fort St. James Hospital Replacement;
- o Primary Health Care in Fort St. James;
- Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure
 - o Walking path on the Stuart River Bridge Fort St. James;
 - East end of François Lake Road road closure when water levels in François Lake rises – the road is a life line for residents;
 - o Colleymount Road proper maintenance and upgrades.

Director Bachrach mentioned that the Town of Smithers would be meeting with Carl Lutz, District Manager, Bulkley-Stikene District in regard to the Bulkley River Bridge in Smithers not having a bike lane and the hazards this has created. Chair Miller noted that he would be willing to attend the meeting also.

Director Petersen reported that in the past a tax had been levied on fuel that was to be used for the repair and upkeep of rural roads.

Director Stimbold reported that the Honourable Terry Lake, Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure will be in Burns Lake in mid-July, 2015.

- Oversite of Rio Tinto Alcan and its water license on the Nechako River;

Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako Procedure Bylaw No. 1633, 2012

Discussion also took place regarding bylaws being given first, second, third reading and adoption in one motion. A bylaw can only be given three readings and adoption when the RD Board is in control, e.g. budget bylaws. If a bylaw requires the consent of more than one party or the Minister of Community, Sport and Cultural Development it cannot be given three readings and adoption in one meeting. A suggestion was made to have first and second reading in one motion, third reading in a separate motion and adoption at a future meeting. Concerns were brought forward that the RDBN has one Board Meeting a month and this may impact the speed in which items are moved forward.

Discussion also took place regarding:

- recording those opposed to a resolution during an RDBN meeting;
- disclosing of a conflict of interest;
- Making a decision regarding a delegation presentation at the same meeting a delegation has presented to the Regional Board
- utilizing technology to be able to allow for the Regional Board to vote on an issue via electronic means;
- late agenda items;

Re-Use Shed Closure and Salvaging Ban August 25, 2015



The intended purpose of the public meetings will be to explain to those attending:

- The reasons why the Re-Use Sheds have been closed and the current challenges surrounding operation of the facilities;
- The issues surrounding the continued salvaging of metal and wood and the rationale behind the implementation of a ban on salvaging;
- An explanation of what has already been tried and investigated in an effort to, in an economically viable manner, deal with the issues surrounding Re-Use Shed operation and salvaging activities at RDBN solid waste management facilities;
- A brief description of the planned review the RDBN Solid Waste Management Plan and the intent of, through the plan review process, to further consider alternative reduce and re-use programs and strategies.
- A request will also be made at the meetings that if any members of the public have suggestions or ideas for how to promote re-use activities that those comments and ideas should be forwarded in writing to the RDBN.



Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako Media Release – Closure of Re-Use Sheds and Banning of Salvaging Activities at Solid Waste Management Facilities

Due to a number of troubling incidents directly affecting staff and public health and safety, Re-Use Sheds located at all Regional District solid waste management facilities will be closed immediately. The latest incidents at the Re-Use Sheds that caused the greatest concern for the Board of Directors are summarized below:


- Over 100 used hypodermic needles were found in boxes mixed in with children's toys;
- Live ammunition was found in a brown cassette tape brief case;
- Prescription drugs were left in a box;
- Reports have been made regarding members of the public urinating and defecating behind a Re-Use Shed and dirty diapers were found thrown in the corner of a Re-Use Shed.

Unfortunately, the manner in which the Re-Use Sheds are currently being operated is not working and is posing serious health and safety risks for RDBN staff, volunteers who are trying keep the facilities clean, and the public (including children) who utilize the Re-Use Sheds.

The Board of Directors is committed to the promotion of waste reduction initiatives such as re-use and it is appreciated the concern that the public may have in the closure of the Re-Use Shed facilities. Investigations are being conducted regarding alternative re-use programs and economically viable solutions to address the health and safety concerns associated with operation of the Re-Use Sheds.

Further, the Board of Directors has directed staff to develop bylaws that would ban salvaging activities at solid waste facilities. Although signage and barriers have been utilized to try to stop people from accessing the stacked wood and metal piles, some members of the public continue to place themselves and others at risk by climbing the piles to salvage materials.

The incidents occurring at the Re-Use Sheds and ongoing salvaging activities have serious legal liability implications to the RDBN taxpayer and as such the Board of Directors is taking the above actions. The RDBN will be holding public meetings in the future to provide additional information.
