CN Recognition 100<sup>th</sup> Year Anniversary of the Last Spike in Fort Fraser

Director Roy mentioned that on May 28, 2014, CN hosted a recognition ceremony to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the last spike in the rail line from Prince Rupert to Prince George. CN also repainted the caboose located in Fort Fraser in honour of the anniversary.

Federation of Canadian Municipalities Rail Safety Committee

Chair Petersen noted that while attending the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) Convention May 30 to June 2, 2014 in Niagara Falls, ON discussions took place regarding the work of the FCM Rail Safety Committee. Chair Petersen mentioned the importance of providing information to the committee in regard to concerns and issues in the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako regarding rail safety.

The FCM Rail Safety Committee noted that CN is meeting the requirements made by the federal government to provide rail car goods information to communities that register with CN. Discussion took place regarding the challenges associated in registering with CN. The information is only provided at the end of the year after the goods have been transported, will only be provided to the signatory of the agreement, are strictly confidential and cannot be shared. This is not timely or beneficial.

Discussion took place regarding CN's response time to an incident being a minimum 12-24 hours as the closest response team is located in Edmonton, Alberta. Concerns were brought forward regarding the impacts to communities, lakes, streams and rivers that CN is in close proximity to as it travels through the RDBN.

Chair Petersen spoke of the Federal Government mandating CN to complete a study to investigate the mitigation of rail transportation of dangerous goods through communities. In locations throughout Canada there is the ability for dangerous goods to bypass communities but in the RDBN most communities have one rail line.

There has been no timeline given for completion of the study.

A comprehensive study regarding the Lac-Megantic, Quebec train derailment tragedy that occurred on July 6, 2013 will be brought forward to the Rural Directors Committee.

A meeting is being planned for October, 2014 with the Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako and Fire Departments within the region to discuss issues and concerns regarding hazmat response to dangerous goods traveling by rail through the region. Fire departments outside the region have also expressed their concerns and have indicated interest in the meetina.

The Local Government Management Association (LGMA), working in partnership with Fire Chiefs' Association of BC (FCABC) and Office of the Fire Commissioner (OFC), Emergency Management BC is hosting the "Working Together: Effective Fire Service Administration for Fire Chiefs and Local Government CAOs Training Program" November 7 to 9, 2014.

The program was initiated in response to the 2010 Fire Services Liaison Group (FSLG) report titled "Fire Safety in BC: Transforming the Fire/Rescue Service" that was presented to the provincial government that contained a number of recommendations for addressing the need to support for training, recruitment and retention, and provide administrative and management support for volunteer fire departments in particular and subsequent response by Emergency Management BC in its 2012 report titled "Improving Fire Services: The Office of the Fire Commissioner's Response to the FSLG Report" which put the LGMA as the lead in developing a training program. The LGMA responded by forming a partnership with FCABC and OFC to develop a program to address this need for training for communities operating volunteer departments, paid on call or composite departments.

The training is aimed primarily at smaller communities to address the pressing need for knowledge, skill development and administrative and financial leadership to effectively operate fire departments in BC. The training will support local government Chief Administrative Officers, Protective Services Managers, and Fire Chiefs in carrying out their responsibilities to provide fire services to their community. It is anticipated that CAOs, Protective Services Managers, and partner Fire Chiefs will attend together.

The training program is planned to run as a 2 day forum, regional format. Participants will be provided with a takeaway workbook organized by tabs consistent with course modules that will include reference material, sample documents, templates and mentor list for use back in the community. The program will be delivered by a team comprised of Fire Chiefs and Chief Administrative Officers.

The central focus of the program is to provide fire service leaders and local government Chief Administrative Officers and Protective Service Managers, with:

a clear understanding of their respective roles and responsibilities in the provision and administration of a local fire service:

### COMMENTS:

This application is regarding a Licence of Occupation on Crown Land for the purpose of sand and gravel extraction and screening. The application area is approximately 16 kilometres northeast of Fort Fraser and is 21.25 ha in size. The nearest residence is approximately 4 km southeast of the application area. Direct access to the application area and proposed gravel pit site currently exists via the Sutherland Forest Service Road.

The gravel pit area contains ±150,000 cubic metres of sand and gravel and is estimated to produce 100-15,000 cubic metres of sand and gravel per year depending on demand. The gravel pit will be located within a clear-cut and will be outside of the riparian area to the north of the application area.

The application area is not zoned in Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako Zoning Bylaw No.700, 1993. It is noted that sand and gravel extraction are subject to Ministry of Energy and Mines regulations.

The Planning Department has no concerns or comments regarding this application.



### MANAGEMENT PLAN

### PROJECT OVERVIEW

Gravel pit to supply sand and gravel for resource road construction and maintenance purposes. I am a road maintenance contractor with an established business based in Fort Fraser. Demand is growing for my services and I need to secure a supply of aggregate it the area to ensure a stable supply for my customers.

The site is approximatly 21.2 hectares located 16 KM by road northeast of Fort Fraser near 7.5 KM on the Sutherland FSR.

The main proposed property is a large deposit of sand and gravel of a quality suitable for road construction and maintenance purposes.

Access to the site is good graveled road right to the site.

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The site was explored on the 6th and 7th of May 2014, good quality gravel and bank sand is exposed is the road cuts and all over the clearcut due to recent logging. A field resource calculation was done for the initial pit onsite with 5 stations on 100 metre intervals perpendicular to the main feature, a gravel ridge.

My estimate based on 23 years experience extracting sand and gravel suggest a resource calculation for the Initial Pit area indicated in the map is 150000 cubic metres.

Production is estimated to be from a 100 to 15000 cubic metres per year depending on activity in the region, logging, mineral exploration and pipelines.

Winter road sand would be screened onsite with a wheel loader and small dry screener.

The site is a clearcut with very little vegatation and soil over the gravel is very thin, < 5cm, but will be stripped and stockpiled for reclemation purposes, unused pit ares will have good drainage, pit walls sloped < 30 degrees and strippings scattered.

Present state of land is 2013 clearcut, with some small areas of umerchantable timber, Crown provincial as indicated on Imap BC, proposed site is adjacent to large Special use permit area by Department of Transportation.

Land impacts will be minimal, respect will be given to wildlife, all activities will be well outside the Riparian areas of the stream to the north.

This project will not influence any social community conditions or public health and operations onsite will be conducted as per The Mines Act
