The FBC and its partners have tackled a wide range of important issues in areas such as climate change and air quality, watersheds and water resources and local sustainability resilience. FBC remains impartial, transpartisan, independent and non-political in its primary role as an educator and facilitator for a sustainable Basin.

The funds will be used to support the following activities: (a) Develop a Nechako Watershed Strategy that will identify priority actions organizations and residents can take to better the health of the Nechako watershed, and, (b) Assist with the Nechako Watershed Roundtable Launch event.

The geographic area that receives services / benefits from the FBC encompasses regional districts within the Fraser Basin including Fraser-Fort George, Bulkley-Nechako, Squamish-Lillooet, Fraser Valley, Cariboo, Thompson-Nicola, Metro Vancouver, and Columbia-Shuswap.

The most impacted communities for this project will be Prince George, Vanderhoof, Fort, St. James, Fraser Lake and Burns Lake as well as the thirteen First Nations communities in the watershed.

Funds will also be used for community outreach in the Bulkley-Nechako Regional District Electoral Areas within the Nechako watershed for the development of a Nechako Watershed Strategy as well as to assist with the delivery of the Nechako Watershed Roundtable Launch scheduled for October 21st and 22nd, 2015.

One of the major challenges to advancing the health of the Nechako watershed is the lack of coordination between government agencies, First Nations, industry, environmental organizations and academic institutions responsible for some form of water management or research. Though there is a desire among these groups to collaborate, a 'bridging' organization is needed to facilitate these partnerships. Based on our recent report on the health of the Nechako River, FBC proposes to facilitate this collaborative process through the development of a Nechako Watershed Strategy which will identify priority stewardship actions in order to better river health.

The Strategy would profile the key watershed health issues and concerns as identified in a new watershed health report and through outreach and engagement with decision makers, stakeholders and the public. More importantly, the Strategy would identify priority actions to be undertaken by organizations, individuals and collaborative efforts to improve the health of the watershed through stewardship.

This request will involve multiple events (workshops, open houses, etc.) as part of the outreach activities for the Nechako Watershed Strategy development. The dates of these activities will be as follows: Vanderhoof meeting (late September), Nechako Watershed Roundtable Launch (October 21 and 22), First Nations community meetings (early and late October).

Project Context:

Over the past two years (2013-14 and 2014-15) the Fraser Basin Council has convened a diversity of decision makers and stakeholders from across the Nechako River Basin in a series of meetings to explore their individual and shared interests in the region. The group formed as the Nechako Watershed Alliance (NWA), an informal affiliation of local governments, First Nations, senior governments, NGOs, academia and individuals all interested in improving the health of the Nechako River watershed. At the February 2015 meeting, the group approved a provisional Terms of Reference and agreed to formalize a roundtable governance structure - the Nechako Watershed Roundtable - to work collaboratively and to use consensus-based decision-making to advance the health of the watershed.



In addition to supporting the organizational development and transition from the Nechako Watershed Alliance to the Nechako Watershed Roundtable, the Fraser Basin Council also collaborated with these regional partners to produce a Nechako Watershed Health Report, including an online, interactive atlas (http://www.cmnbc.ca/atlas_gallery/nechako-watershed-health-atlas). This project has assembled the best available data on water quality and quantity, fish and wildlife, ecosystems, resource development and resource conservation.

At the February 2015 meeting of the NWA the group reviewed the watershed health indicators — Including the online atlas — and identified a shared interest in developing a strategy to address the findings in the watershed health report and promote priority actions (i.e. to get from information to action). This information about the health of the Nechako provides a solid base of knowledge to inform the development of the Nechako Watershed Strategy.

Other organizations have attended meetings but have not participated as regularly. These include the Bulkley-Nechako Regional District, Nechako River Sturgeon Recovery Initiative, North Central Local Government Association and Resources North Association. We plan on engaging all of these and other organizations in the project. During the outreach and engagement phase, we will attempt to hold a at least one meeting about the project in each of the communities (local governments and First Nations) in the Nechako watershed to share information from the Nechako Watershed Health Report, to invite participation in the NWA and to engage in the development and implementation of the strategy. Examples of communities that would be engaged in the project but are not yet participating in the NWA include: Fraser Lake, Fort St. James, Burns Lake and some First Nation communities.

The collaborative, consensus-based process will increase the likelihood of effective project delivery. By engaging and collaborating with government, NGOs, and others, we will be able to pool resources and align priority actions with the corresponding interests, expertise and jurisdictions of the partner organizations. We will work to expand the partnership over the course of the project.



Recreation Referral File No. REC192084

This referral is regarding an application to establish a recreation trail designation under Section 56 of the *Forest and Range Practices Act*. The trail is located 100 meters east of the District of Houston via Morice Telkwa FSR. The application area consists of an approximately 11 kilometres long trail which will provide access to the Morice River and connect to the already existing 1.69 kilometre Klinger Lake trail.

This trail would be added to a formal stewardship agreement between Recreation Sites and Trails BC (RSTBC) and Houston Hikers Society. This agreement will give the society the ability to better manage and preserve this public recreation resource.



The application area is zoned Agriculture (Ag1) under Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako Zoning Bylaw No.700, 1993. Outdoor Recreation Facilities are a permitted use in the Ag1 zone.

The southern part of the proposed application area, along the Morice River, is located in the floodplain, according to Schedule A: "Bulkley River – Quick to Houston" of Regional District

of Bulkley-Nechako Floodplain Management Bylaw No. 1300, 2004. Construction within the floodplain is required to meet specific elevation and setback requirements, as set out in the bylaw.

It is noted that the Houston, Topley, Granisle Rural Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 1622, 2011 designates the area around Klinger Lake as Parks and Recreation (P), which supports protecting and enhancing the lake's recreational value.

The application area is located within the Agriculture Land Reserve (ALR), and therefore the Province should consult with the Agriculture Land Commission (ALC) regarding the proposal.

This application is regarding a Crown Grant to obtain additional land for extensive agriculture purposes. The subject properties located near Layton Road, 16 km northwest of the District of Vanderhoof. The properties are approximately 16.1 ha and 20.2 ha totalling 36.3 ha (89.69 acres) in size.



The applicant owns a ¼ section property at 12129 Highway 27 S, 8 km from the subject properties. The intent of this application is to provide additional arable land for forage production. The land is currently vacant and forested.

The application area is zoned Ag1 in the Regional District of Bulkley Nechako Zoning Bylaw No. 700, 1993. It is noted that any new parcels created to accommodate the Crown Grant

should comply with the minimum parcel area requirement of the Ag1 zone, which is 16 ha (39.5 acres).
