#### NWIPC Funding for 2014

Carolynn Lane, Sustainability Assistant noted that the Northwest Invasive Plant Council (NWIPC) operates on the basis of critical species, harm to human health and livestock, etc.

While the communities on the Southside are famous for their lakes and abundant nature, there is a surprising lack of public space available for recreation and enjoying the natural heritage of the area. Although there are sites such as the British Columbia Recreation Sites managed by the "Recreation Sites and Trails Branch of the Ministry of Forests, Lands, and Natural



Resource Operations", these sites are often limited (although free) without any enhancements to encourage visitors to stay longer or to provide additional recreational opportunities for the community like a BC Park would. Locals or tourists interested in immersing themselves into the area will find that there are few functioning trails in the vicinity to hike through and those we have are not adequately signed (so difficult to find), no public recreation parks to take their children for a day in the sun, and no obvious areas to soak up the beauty of Northern BC.

This project intends to create such an area on the Southside, where families can go for a lovely day out. The spot is located on beautiful Takysie Lake, where there is currently an old camping ground, broken boat launch, and an unkempt beach. SEDA intends to clean the beach and repair the boat launch to make the area accessible to everyone. In addition, we plan to add a trail, a dock, and covered BBQ area, all intended to attract interest in the site. The proposed walking trail which will have connections to an existing heritage trail as well it will be part of the network of trails being designed to encompass the areas tourism amenities. The plan is to provide a space in the community for families to gather and to attract tourists to come spend time on the Southside

Apportionment of Costs to Rural Fire Departments

### **Background**

Historically, rural fire protection was managed by local societies or contracted to municipal fire departments with financial assistance from the RDBN through its rural fire protection service areas. RDBN staff time was minimal and consisted mostly of managing the financial aspects of the relationships with fire departments as well as facilitating any boundary expansions or new service areas. No RDBN Staff costs were charged to the rural fire protection service areas.

### **Current Situation**

Starting in 2011, with Emergency Preparedness Staff (now Protective Services) becoming more involved in dealing with operational aspects of rural fire departments, the RDBN started allocating 20% of Emergency Preparedness Staff costs and related expenses to Rural Government. This was about \$21,000 in 2011. The draft 2014 budget includes about \$42,000 related to Protective Services Staff (including \$3,600 of premises costs that are allocated based on headcount).

### The Issue

The costs of Rural Government are borne by all rural taxpayers in the RDBN, including those that are not able receive fire protection services. Initially, when the costs were relatively small, the impact on rural taxpayers was not that material. However, as these costs have increased significantly, Finance Staff and Protective Services Staff are recommending that the costs be apportioned to the rural fire protection services in proportion to estimated time spent on those services. Based on this estimate, 75% of the cost would be allocated equally to the four rural fire protection services provided by rural fire departments organized as local societies and 25% would be allocated equally to the six rural fire protection services provided by municipal fire departments under contract with the RDBN.

### **Fire Protection Service Taxation Capacity**

A significant consideration is the capacity of each rural fire protection service to absorb these costs under their current tax limits. The table below shows that:

- 1. Five rural fire protection services operated by municipal fire departments have sufficient room under the existing tax limits to absorb the additional costs;
- Fort Fraser and Vanderhoof rural fire protection services can absorb the additional costs, but this will bring them close to their tax limits. The tax limits could be increased by 25% without referendum or alternative approval process;



 Southside, Cluculz Lake, Topley and Burns Lake fire protection services will require tax limit increases to accommodate the additional costs. A 25% tax limit increase is enough for Burns Lake Rural Fire Protection, but not for Southside, Cluculz Lake or Topley.

Even though not all of the rural fire protection services can accommodate the proposed changes without the approval of the electors, Staff feel that the RDBN should do what it can to allocate the costs appropriately and phase the rest in over time.

### Recommendations

- 1. Increase the tax limits by 25% for the following rural fire protection services:
  - Fort Fraser
  - Southside:
  - Cluculz Lake;
  - Topley;
  - Burns Lake;
  - Vanderhoof.
- Apportion 25% of the allocated Protective Services costs equally to the six municipally operated rural fire protection service areas (Fort St. James and Luck Bay count as one because they are both operated by the Fort St. James Fire Department).
- 3. Apportion 75% of the allocated Protective Services costs equally to the four rural fire protection services operated by local societies to the extent made possible by the new tax limits, with the excess allocated to Rural Government Administration, and phased in to the rural fire departments as tax limits permit.

If the Rural Directors Committee agrees, the appropriate bylaws to accommodate the proposed tax limit increased would be brought before the Board at its meeting on March 20, 2014 and the above recommendations would be reflected in the RDBN local service budgets for these services.

Regarding: Wildfire Management Communications Planning

Staff met with the Smithers and Prince George Wildfire Management staff to discuss communications protocols on August 29, 2013 and November 13, 2013.

At those meetings Regional District staff presented the following concerns:

- The Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako should know about any fire that may cause threat to structures in the region.
- > The Regional District of Bulkley-Nechako has minimal staff and a vast region to provide emergency response to.
- > The RDBN covers one of the largest areas in BC and deals with two Regional Wildfire Management Headquarters and three Zone Offices.
- The RDBN office and staff are located in Burns Lake; it is difficult to know what is going on in the rest of the region without communication from Wildfire Management.
- Staff has a responsibility to the politicians and the public should there be a concern regarding wildfire threat.
- If smoke is noticed, the phone calls start coming in; if we have no information on wildfires, staff time is spent looking for reasons/information regarding the smoke.
- Timely notice of wildfire situations will allow earlier staff preparation of work schedules, mapping, drafting notifications and documents etc. which results in more effective response.
- > The RDBN does not give out fire information to the public and directs the public to the Wildfire Management Branch website.
- Much of the RDBN's EOC budget is spent on looking for wildfire information/answers, when a simple call or an e-mail would suffice in easing everyone's concerns.
- ➤ Communications from WMB have greatly improved by the end of 2013's wildfire season, which resulted in less stress for everyone continuation and improvement is key moving forward..

As a result of the meetings the two Wildfire Management Headquarters have agreed as follows:

- 2014 WMB will provide a trial 2 tier communications system as follows:
  - 1. a generic e-mail that will include the following information:
    - ✓ longitude;
    - ✓ latitude:

✓ a 5 kms impact range will be used instead of 2 kms.

- RDBN staff will attend the Operational meetings at the Nadina Zone office on Mondays and Thursdays, starting between April 15th through to October. These meetings will discuss:
  - ✓ weather patterns and predictions;
  - ✓ wildfire situation reports;
  - ✓ a verbal update on wildfire events in the Van/Jam Zone; and
- RDBN staff will not be authorized to attend the Prince George Operational Meetings via conference call.
- Wildfire Management has dictated that extending the boundary radius to 5 kms will have a workload impact on their fire control rooms in both the Prince George and Northwest Fire Centres, and until the impact of this additional work load is documented and considered they will not be able to provide additional information.
- ➤ The 5 kms radius will trigger an automatic email to advise of any potential future issue with a wildfire, and as discussed previously if there is a need for the RDBN to prepare for response WMB will be making a phone call to our office as soon as possible. In terms of ensuring RDBN staff are available and on alert, WMB believes that action item #2 above will allow for direct contact and information from the zone manager in Burns Lake. This would allow the RDBN to assess the weather patterns and gain information on the current situation within the region.





## Yekooche First Nation Community Disposal System

#### Location

Ye Koo Che I.R. No. 3 is located along the northwest arm of Stuart Lake, approximately 75 km west of Fort St. James, British Columbia. The community's current infrastructure facilities consist of a school, band office, a 2 km network of gravel roads, two bridges (one pedestrian footbridge and one single lane vehicle bridge), a community water supply system, a community sewage collection system (off reserve), and a landfill (off reserve) for solid waste disposal. BC Hydro provides power to the community through overhead lines. The community also owns a private telecommunications system. This system provides both telecommunication and internet access through a wireless, satellite transmission from Yekooche that connects to the Telus system in Fort St. James. The current resident population is approximately 143.

### **Background**

Prior to the construction of a community septic tank and ground disposal field in 2010, Yekooche's wastewater collection system consisted of a gravity sewage effluent collection system comprised of conventional sewer mains and manholes. The system collected effluent from individual septic tanks and directed the waste to a wastewater pumping station. From there it was pumped to a two-cell lagoon system. The lagoon treatment system consisted of a facultative treatment cell followed by a seasonal storage cell.

The treated wastewater was discharged from the storage cell under Permit No. PE-7411 (issued by the Ministry of Water, Land and Air Protection — MWLAP), originally issued to the Stuart-Trembleur Indian Band (now the Yekooche First Nation) in 1986. The permit allowed a maximum daily volume discharge of 280 m³ between July 1 and September 30 annually, to a natural marsh adjoining Stuart Lake. The permit required that the effluent biochemical oxygen demand (BOD), total suspended solids (TSS) and total phosphorus (TP) concentrations of 45 mg/L, 60 mg/L and 1.5 mg/L, respectively, must not be exceeded. The permit also specified that MWLAP must be notified prior to any controlled discharge or implementing any changes to the process that may affect quantity and/or quality of the effluent. The seasonal storage cell of the lagoon system experienced large amounts of infiltration/exfiltration due to a combination of unsuitable existing berm soils and a fissured rock interface with the storage cell. The existing storage cell berm was constructed of an unstable material and had slumped as much as 1.5 m at one corner of the lagoon. During the spring run-off in 1999, 2001 and 2002, emergency discharges outside the permitted discharge period were required to lower the liquid levels to a safe depth.

The Band was out of compliance with its lagoon permit on a number of occasions for a number of reasons. Given the evident substantial failure and the ongoing permit violations associated with the lagoon system, and upon request of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada, R. Radloff & Associates completed a detailed assessment of potential treatment options for a long term wastewater disposal alternative for Yekooche.

Based on construction options, environmental impacts, hydro-geological and geotechnical conditions and operational considerations, a community septic tank and ground disposal field were installed.

Several sites were considered for the location of the new system. Geotechnical and hydro-geological investigations were undertaken (Permit No. FUP 15016) and it was determined that the location of the new system the sewage disposal field criteria.

Use of the sewage lagoon system has been discontinued, and the existing treatment cell has been drained, but remains available for emergency backup. The seasonal storage cell has been filled in and reclaimed. The new tank and disposal field has been constructed and is now in use.

#### **Nature and Use**

Yekooche First Nation applied for a Crown Land Tenure in February 2003 for a Statutory Right of Way. The application process was never completed and the Province made the decision to issue a Licence of Occupation (Licence No. 706191). The Band is now re-applying for a Crown Land Tenure to provide a Statutory Right of Way to allow Yekooche First Nation unencumbered access to its community disposal system for operation and maintenance purposes.

## **Development and Operating Schedule**

Yekooche's community disposal system was completed in 2010. The new lift station consists of a 2.44 m diameter Fibreglass Reinforced Plastic (FRP) structure with a concrete base. The lift station and pumping station have been designed to handle an anticipated peak flow of 2.21 L/s over a 20 year period. Using a 33 HP electric submersible pump, sewage effluent is pumped into lift station #2. Lift station #2 uses 7.5 HP electric submersible pumps to pump to the dosing tank located near the disposal fields.

The new forcemain is a 100 mm diameter high density polyethylene (HDPE DR17) pipe. The total length of the forcemain is 2,067 m starting from the lift station and ending at the dosing chamber. The forcemain follows existing road alignments and crosses Nancut Creek at two locations under the bottom of the creek. The pipe is buried under 2.7 m of earth to provide sufficient cover to protect from freezing and generally follows existing ground contour.

These have been designed to facilitate periodic discharge of sewage effluent into the disposal fields. These tanks store sewage effluent pumped from the lift station until the desired dose volume is reached. Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) Design Guidelines for Wastewater Systems recommends an intermittent dosing frequency of 4 doses/day for the sandy textured soils encountered in the disposal field areas. It also recommends maintaining a minimum pressure of 7 kPa at the end of each distribution line. To meet the requirements of the design guidelines a dose volume equal to approximately two times the internal volume of the distribution pipes was used. The dose volume and frequency is regulated by a combination of floats installed in the dosing tank and automatic valves installed on lines leading to the disposal field. The volume of the dosing chamber was determined

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based on the maximum possible accumulation of sewage effluent in the tanks to maintain dosing volume and frequency while accommodating the maximum daily flow. An overflow pipe from the dosing chander has been connected to the disposal fields to bypass sewage to the fields in case of overflowing the tanks due to malfunctioning of equipment or power outages. An automatic start back-up generator powers the whole system during power outages. The system is equipped with a visual alarm indicator and radio transmitter to communicate with the Band office in case of any malfunctioning of equipment.

Detailed hydro-geological evaluations, geotechnical investigations and environmental assessments were carried out during the pre-design stage of the project to locate a suitable site for the sewage disposal fields. A location near the existing landfill, following the trail to the village, was selected with areas for two primary sewage disposal fields and a third area for standby. The soil type in these areas was categorized in two typical zones. One zone consists of 0.15 m of topsoil over sand that extends to a typical depth of at least 2.90 m, and the other consists of 0.15 m of topsoil over sand to a depth of 0.80 m, over gravel to a depth of at least 2.20 m.

The two sewage disposal fields have been designed to evenly apply sewage effluent over the trench area. In designing the ground disposal fields, applicable sections of both the Municipal Sewage Regulation (MSR) and INAC's Design Guidelines were followed. The location of the fields is capable of handling the maximum daily flow and will be operated alternately on a yearly basis. A manually operated gate valve has been provided to switch between the fields as required. Sewage effluent is spread in trenches filled with drain rock by 75 mm diameter perforated laterals. Each field is divided into five zones, each zone having 12 laterals of 25.1 m length. The total length of laterals in each field is 1,506 m. Sewage effluent is dosed approximately four times per day (every 5.8 hours). 13.4 m<sup>3</sup> of sewage effluent is discharged per dose into the field.

The sewage disposal fields are located along contour on ground sloping gently from southeast towards northwest direction. Field #1 lies between ground elevations of 714 and 721 m and Field #2 between elevations of 722 m and 725 m. the finished surface slopes for Field #1 and Field #2 are respectively 15% and 8%. The numbers of orifices on laterals vary in order to discharge equal volumes of effluent from each lateral depending on the residual pressure head at the lateral. Orifices are spaced equally within a trench and the variation of absorption area per orifice over the entire system was kept to a minimum to obtain even distribution of effluent within a trench as well as over the entire system. The maximum orifice discharge rate variation within each lateral for Field #1 and Field #2 are respectively 6% and 6.7%. The minimum and maximum absorption areas per orifice for Field #1 are respectively 0.55 m² and 1.05 m² and those for Field #2 are respectively 0.57 m² and 0.90 m².

The orifices are oriented at the bottom of the laterals and the sizes and numbers of orifices on laterals at the same elevation were kept uniform for ease of construction. All connection pipes have been sized to balance the entire system to maintain required flow and pressure condition minimizing head losses. Manually operated gate valves have been provided on each line heading to each zone for future adjustments if required.



The hydrogoological investigation and environmental impact study (EIS) carried out by Pacific Hydrology consultants Ltd. addressed the effect of subsurface effluent discharge on surface and ground water and its impact on human health and the environment. After detailed evaluations and projections of groundwater mounding, path of effluent flow and direction and velocity of groundwater flow, estimates of hydraulic conductivity, using the worst-case scenario, the study concluded that the proposed effluent discharge will not adversely impact groundwater or surface streams in the area.

Construction included hydroseeding of the exposed soil in the disposal field areas as well as any areas disturbed by construction activities to minimize the potential for erosion and subsequent deleterious sedimentation.

The structural analysis and detailed design for the utility building, as well as the foundation for the lift station, were prepared by Access Engineering Consultants Ltd.


The electrical design for power supply to various equipment and related controls was performed by NRS Engineering Ltd. The electrical design work included designing a control panel for pumps and ancillary equipment, phase converter (to convert single phase electric power to 3 phases), standby power unit, control panel for dosing chamber, and miscellaneous control and protection arrangements.






As-built drawings are included as part of the application package and contain detailed drawings of the new system.






