Request to RDBN: \$15,000 per year for two years 17% of project budget

Ms. Merrick noted that the nature of farming in the north is land extensive and the value retained from the land is low. The northern region requires more land for its product in comparison to the orchards in the southern part of the province. Due to the economic difficulty in the beef industry in the past there has not been a lot of revenue. It is a matter of scale the smaller producers can build a local customer base but due to costs aren't able to move to the middle range and mid-size operations have a difficult time expanding to outside markets due to costs and economies of scale. Most agriculture in the north is commodity based.

Discussion took place regarding conversations with First Nations. Ms. Merrick mentioned that discussions have taken place with Nak'azdli First Nations regarding its green house project. Most dialogue is with actual operators and business development is through the entrepreneurs.

If funds aren't raised for the project to continue, the Regional District of Fraser-Fort George has identified the Beyond the Market Strategy for the Robson Valley, thus funding may be region based. If other funds are not made available the project will need to be scaled back.

Chair Miller thanked Ms. Merrick for attending the meeting.

Chair Miller mentioned that he had discussed with Northern Development Initiative Trust (NDIT) its proposal to provide planning services to local governments. NDIT had expressed its apologies for not initially speaking with planners with in the region regarding the proposal. NDIT indicated there are communities within the region that do not have a planning department and have requested support from the Provincial Government. The Provincial Government has approached NDIT to possibly assist with capacity in the form of a pilot project. NDIT indicated that there would be an opportunity for University of Northern B.C. (UNBC) graduates to intern and assist in the project. It is not intended to move planning to a centralized location.

Discussion took place regarding the need for planners for communities within the region and to assist in the industrial activity occurring in the north. Capacity is an important consideration and having one planner and two interns to assist the number of communities within the north may not provide the best capacity for those in need. Discussion regarding the option to provide the funding to local governments directly to hire additional staff to address the specific issues facing each local government was brought forward.

As a pilot project NDIT intends to look at the needs of six communities to try and address the immediate needs brought forward.

The importance of having discussions with local government planners throughout the north was identified.
