Discussion:

The capital grant for the upgrade to the pharmacy at St. John Hospital is in the currently approved budget. SNRHD provided \$268,800 for phase one of this project in 2020 and the request for the project in 2021 is \$520,000.

The year-to-date actuals are on track with the approved budget, the exception being that Northern Health has not yet requested a drawing of funds for the Stuart Lake Hospital.

WHEREAS, the Board of the Stuart-Nechako Regional Hospital District proposes to expend money for capital expenditures included in the 2021 annual budget;

AND WHEREAS, those capital expenditures have received the approval required under Section 23 of the *Hospital District Act*;

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of the Stuart-Nechako Regional Hospital District enacts the following capital expenditure bylaw as required by Section 32 of the *Hospital District Act*;

1. The Board hereby authorizes and approves expenditures of money necessary to complete the following capital expenditures totaling \$520,000 representing a portion of the capital expenditures included in the 2021 budget more particularly detailed as follows:
